Barcelona Airport, [El Prat](#), is located just 16km outside the city and 18km from the Hilton Diagonal Mar Barcelona. Only a 30 minutes drive to arrive there!

Barcelona has become the Mediterranean's most important cruise ship harbor. It has nine passenger terminals, seven for cruise liners and four for ferries. It has connections with the Balearic Islands and the main Mediterranean harbors in Italy and Morocco

Eight colour-coded metro lines, more than 1.000 buses on over 80 routes, a city rail network run by the Catalan government, and a modern tram system: the most convenient way of getting around Barcelona

The Hilton Diagonal Mar Barcelona is located 1 minute walk from the Bus line and 5 minutes walking from the Maresme Forum metro stop

Transport passes can be used on the metro, Barcelona's tram, the bus network and the suburban rail | There are different types of travel cards and transport passes that are valid throughout the public transport network (metro, buses, tram and suburban rail), including the T-10 card which is valid for 10 journeys, or day passes (2, 3, 4 and 5 days) | Single ticket: 2,15 € - T-10: 9.95 € | Airport Ticket from Metro |

There is a ticket valid for a single trip to the airport from any network station or subway to get from the airport to any metro station Barcelona. Airport fare: €4.50 | All the transport network is adapted for people with reduced mobility

The bike is an original and different means of transport to discover the city. Barcelona has fully integrated cycle lanes and you can cycle through the city's open spaces and parks. These conditions and the mild climate are ideal for this alternative means of transport


