Romans virtually invented bridge building, though lovers weren't top of mind, twilight from the Tiber is impossibly romantic.










Statesmen and dignitaries who have worked at the most prestigious desks around the world, rarely fail to remark on the beauty of this 18th century masterpiece.

THE CORNER SUITE




The Corner Suites house some remarkable furnishings by the most collectable French 18th century cabinet makers; plump up your cushions, take a seat and enjoy a private view.



Lie back on your 'floating featherbed' and set sail for heaven.


THE VISTA SUITE




Chase around the pillars, hide on the balcony, then pause for a mature appreciation of the rich art that fills this bedroom gallery.






TERRAZZA DEGLI ARANCI

PRIVATE VIEW OF A PERSONAL COLLECTION

Baroque and Venetian masterpieces worthy of a museum.



One wall is adorned with a 1720s tapestry, The triumph of Mars, created by brothers and famed Flemish weavers, Vabain and Daniel Leyniers. At eight metres long, it is an extremely rare piece.

Cesare Zocchi (1875-1922) created this white marble statue of Minos, King of Crete, who was punished by Poseidon for his betrayal and sent to the Underworld to become one of the two guardians of Hell.





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
