



Envisioned as a sanctuary for luxury travelers, the new rooms have been fashioned in delicate powder blue and warm terracotta tones.












Evolution of a district, explore Rome under a new light

The St. Regis Rome has carefully selected for its guests five special places to discover, all located within one mile from our entrance.

Santa Maria della Vittoria displays one of the richest decorations in all of Rome. As you walk under the gilded ceiling, surrounded by the most precious marbles, nothing can really prepare you for the vision of the ecstasy of Saint Teresa, Gianlorenzo Bernini's most moving masterpiece.

Diocletian Baths and Museo Massimo, home to famous pieces such as the legendary Discobolus, and the impressive frescoes detached from the Villa of Livia, Emperor Augustus's wife. Amongst the countless number of famous statues, mosaics, and precious objects, don't miss the bronze statue of the boxer.

Palazzo Barberini represents the apogee of the splendor of life in the Baroque Rome. the palace hosts an impressive collection of paintings including the legendary Fornarina by Raphael and the mesmerizing Judith Beheading Holofernes by Caravaggio. The grand staircase designed by Gianlorenzo Bernini access the Grand Salon, featuring one of the highest ceilings in Rome, magnificently decorated by Pietro da Cortona.

Cappella Bessarione, a mysterious Renaissance chapel rediscovered after centuries of oblivion in the Chiesa dei Santi XII Apostoli.

Palazzo Doria Pamphilj, a tribute from the neoclassical age to the ancient Roman tradition of the thermal baths.








The Evolution of a District Tour & Partnership with Baths of Diocletian

Private visit to The Baths of Diocletian, National Roman Museum, where to live a unique virtual reality experience transported back to 298 A.D., when the emperor Diocletian started to build – in that precise location – a magnificent "palace for the people" with hot-water pools and tubs, as well as gymnasiums, libraries, and a lavish garden. The immersive story continues with the transformation of the complex into a monastery by Michelangelo and ends with the construction of the new district with its grand palaces which until today still maintain the architecture of the original baths. The virtual reality experience, created with the support of the hotel, is available upon request in the hotel for the St. Regis Rome guests and also for the visitors of the Museo Nazionale Romano inside the octagonal aula according to a pre-established schedule.

Aristocratic Splendour Tour

The St. Regis Rome contributed to the restoration program promoted by the Fondazione Torlonia, which aims to enhance the extraordinary heritage of Villa Albani Torlonia. In particular, thanks to the support of The St. Regis Rome, two magnificent Roman sculptures dating back to the first Imperial period (Ist-2nd centuries AD), have been restored with a masterful intervention and returned to their original location in the Villa.
